GRENOSIDE STEEL WORKS

An early five hole crucible steel furnace cellar, dating from 1797, is relatively undisturbed since the plot was sold in 1869 after steel production there ceased.

The site is (grade 2) listed and is not normally open to the public.

A visit includes:

- An exhibition of research material and artefacts found around the site.
- Local metallurgist and historians present to describe its historical and industrial context and take questions.
- A short tour down stone steps to the furnace cellar.



Allow about an hour and a half

A walk around industrial past of Grenoside and woodlands is recommended.

Toilet, tea and coffee on site or nearby in the village.
